#### Manx BirdLife Christmas Bird Race rules

- Observations must be made within the 7 day period from Christmas Day to the end of the year (between 00.00 on 25/12/2015 and 24:00 on 31/12/2015).
- It isn't a competition between individual birdwatchers, the aim is for Manx birdwatchers to work together to see the maximum number of species possible.
- You can submit sightings either by email to <u>manxchristmasbirds@gmail.com</u>, by using the reporting form on Manx BirdLife's website, http://manxbirdlife.im, by Twitter (to '@ManxBirdLife', hashtag #ManxBirdRace), Facebook or by text message to 07976 421992.
- For all observations, send your name, the date and place of the observation, what you saw (Name of species, how many) and any interesting aspects of what you saw.
