



# The Isle of Man Christmas Bird Race 2020

## Use this recording sheet to keep track of what you've seen, what's been reported and what is left to be looked for!

At the end of each day, the Manx BirdLife website will be updated with the total number of species reported so far during the race period. Updates will also be posted on Manx BirdLife's Facebook pages and Twitter account. The most likely species to be seen are listed overleaf. Tick off each species as they are seen. Add in extra species if necessary.

### Manx BirdLife Christmas Bird Race rules

- You can spend as little or as much time as you wish looking for birds. Sightings can be made of birds on, above and around the Island within Manx territorial waters.
- Sightings can be during the 7-day period from Christmas Day to New Year's Eve inclusive (i.e. 00:01 on 25<sup>th</sup> Dec to 23:59 on 31<sup>st</sup> Dec).
- It isn't a competition! The aim is for birdwatchers across the island to work collectively to see the maximum number of species possible.
