

Owls are silent, night-time hunters. They are nocturnal, which means they come out at night and do their hunting then. They rest and sleep (known as roosting) throughout the day. Owls are birds of prey or raptors.

Just like other birds of prey they eat meat, which means they are *carnivores*. The main difference between owls and other birds of prey is that they hunt at night, whereas birds like Peregrine Falcon, Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Kestrel and Eagle all hunt during the day. These birds have excellent eyesight which they use to spot their prey, whereas owls are quite different. Look at the pictures of the owls below and study the shape of their faces.

Owls faces are very round, or disk shaped. Their eyes are very large, but they cannot move them like a human can. They have a special flexible neck which they can rotate almost all the way round. You can't see their ears, but if you could, you would notice that they are at different heights on the sides of their faces; they are asymmetrical. The soft feathers around the face send sound waves to the ears to help the owl hear where their prey is. It is said an owl can hear a mouse up to 75 feet away! Their soft feathers also mean they fly silently so can sneak up on their prey without being heard. Owls beaks are very low on their faces and this helps them be able to see their prey much more easily.

Owls eat a variety of different small mammals, including mice, rats, voles and sometimes rabbits. They eat their prey whole, but cannot digest things like bones, teeth and fur. To get rid of these the owls' spit or regurgitate them out in what is called a pellet.

Here in the Isle of Man we have three different types of owl: Barn Owl (below left), Shorteared Owl (middle) and Long-eared Owl (right).






